

## Notifying the School Regarding Suspected or Confirmed Covid Cases During the 48hours After School Ends on 28<sup>th</sup> May

<p>If my child develops symptoms of COVID19 within 48 hours of being in school -i.e. <b><u>up to and including Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May</u></b></p>	<p>If my child develops symptoms of COVID19 more than 48 hours after their last day in school <b><u>i.e from Monday 31<sup>st</sup> May</u></b></p>	<p>If my child has no symptoms of COVID19 but tests positive within 48 hours of being in school-<b><u>i.e. up to and including Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May</u></b></p>	<p>If my child is identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19</p>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Get a PCR test for your child and the household must isolate at home until the test result is returned. Let the school know that this has occurred (see below for details of how to do this).</li> <li>• If the PCR test result is positive for COVID19, you must inform the school</li> <li>• If the test result is negative, you should inform the school and you do not need to take any further action.</li> <li>• <b>You should contact Mr. Rogers, by calling 07434758181 between the hours of 9am and 11am (up to Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May). Calls will not be answered outside these hours. After May 30<sup>th</sup> ,you should contact NHS Test and Trace</b></li> <li>• When you call, you must provide the following: name of child/ren, class, date of symptoms starting and any clubs or on-site child care used on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> May.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Get a PCR test for your child and the household must isolate at home until the test result is returned.</li> <li>• If the PCR test result is positive for COVID-19, having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, (Monday 31<sup>st</sup> May onwards) you must contact NHS Test and Trace and follow the advice given by them: <a href="http://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/">www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/testing-and-tracing/</a></li> <li>• <b>Do NOT telephone the school number given, if your child develops symptoms after Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May-you must contact NHS Test and Trace as detailed above.</b></li> <li>• Contact the school if your child will be absent, in time for the first day of the new term via the school <a href="mailto:office@ingravejohnstone.essex.sch.uk">office@ingravejohnstone.essex.sch.uk</a> e-mail. We will access these messages when we return to school after the half term break.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You should access a PCR test only when your child is showing signs of COVID19. However, if your child is asymptomatic and returns a positive test result within 48 hours of last being in school, please let the school know straight away.</li> <li>• <b>You should contact Mr. Rogers by calling 07434758181 between the hours of 9am and 11am (up to Sunday, 30<sup>th</sup> May). Do not attempt to call outside of these hours as your call will not be answered and do not leave messages. Calls will not be answered after May 30<sup>th</sup> -you should then contact NHS Test and Trace</b></li> <li>• You must provide the following: name of child/ren, class, date of symptoms starting and any clubs or on-site child care used on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> May.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If you are contacted by the school because your child is identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID19, they must self-isolate for 10 days and get a PCR test if they then develop symptoms.</li> <li>• The school will contact you via Parent Mail up to 30th May to inform you that your child will need to self-isolate. After this time, you will be contacted by the NHS Test and Trace team, until we return to school on June 8<sup>th</sup>.</li> </ul>
